Frequently Asked Recycling Questions

Where can I recycle my glass jars and bottles, plastic bottles, aluminum and tin cans?

If you subscribe to curbside service, all these items can be placed in your recycle bins for curbside pick-up. If you are a drop off customer, bins are available in the centrally located dumpster sheds. Please remove lids from bottles and jars (this means lids from plastic bottles also). Recyclables can be mixed together, there is no need to separate!

What kind of glass jars and bottles, plastic bottles, aluminum and tin cans are acceptable to recycle? When recycling glass jars and bottles please recycle only food and beverage jars (i.e. spaghetti sauce jars, soda bottles, etc.) Plastic bottles are only acceptable if they include the #1 or #2 symbols indicated on the bottom of the bottle (liter pop bottles, milk, water & orange juice jugs and laundry detergent bottles are okay!) Please recycle only food and beverage aluminum and tin cans (vegetable/fruit cans, etc.) It is acceptable to leave the labels on all of these items when recycling. Please take a couple of minutes to rinse out these items before placing them in your recycling bin.

Can I recycle newspapers with the other curbside or drop-off recyclables? Sure. Just place in your curbside or drop-off bin.



FAQ's Continued...

How about cardboard? Please take your clean, corrugated cardboard to the nearest dumpster shed located on Brush Creek Road and place beside recycle bins. Please also make sure that boxes are broken down and packing materials are removed from the boxes before recycling.

Where can I recycle office pack and magazines in Snowmass Village? You can drop off office pack and magazines at the large green recycling receptacle located in the parking lot of the Town Operations Facility, 3745 Owl Creek Road (almost directly across from the Pines Subdivision entrance.) Office pack includes white typing and copy paper, pastel and yellow legal pad paper, computer paper, envelopes (plastic windows okay!) Only slick glossy magazines or advertisements are acceptable.



We cannot accept the following items as "recyclable": Window glass, ceramics, plates, oven-ware, crystal, mirrors, stained glass, motor oil containers, tub containers (butter tubs, yogurt containers, etc.), flower pots, wax paper, day glow/neon paper (Astrobrights), Tyvek or plastic envelopes (overnight mailers) and pads of sticky notes. If you are not sure if something is recyclable please give us a call before recycling.

Trash Services

The town offers many different forms of trash removal services including residential curbside service (for residents in the Horse Ranch and Crossings subdivisions, Fairway Drive and Beaver Court only), rearload, roll-off and drop-off dumpster service.

Frequently Asked Trash Service Questions:

I am a resident of Snowmass, why don't I have curbside service? Due to the large expanse of area and the need to maintain an efficient level of service in the Snowmass Village area, the Solid Waste and Recycle Department has had to limit the curbside service areas to Horse Ranch, Crossings, Fairway Drive and Beaver Court. Dumpster sheds are available along Brush Creek Road for residents who do not reside in these areas.

Why am I paying for an annual flat fee? Since the town instituted curbside/recycle service in the Horse Ranch and Crossings subdivisions and residences located on Fairway Drive and Beaver Court, not all residents subscribe to curbside service. Unless residents are taking their trash to the Pitkin County Landfill, they are depositing their trash at the residential drop-off sites located on Brush Creek Road and elsewhere in town. Whether they are aware of it or not, these residents are not paying for trash service. In order to make it fair for everyone, and to recover lost revenues, the town initiated a flat fee for all single family residences.

What about paint and car batteries?

These items are considered hazardous materials. Please do not put these items in your trash. The landfill has the appropriate resources to handle these materials.

What about refrigerators? Refrigerators contain a hazardous material called "Freon" which makes it difficult for a refrigerator to just be thrown away. A licensed refrigerator operator will need to be contacted to extract the Freon before being disposed. Please call us for further information
