







# What Can I Recycle in Snowmass Village?

CATEGORIES	YES!	HOW?	NO!
<b>"MIXED" RECYCLABLES:</b>	<b>GLASS JARS &amp; BOTTLES, PLASTIC BOTTLES, ALUMINUM &amp; TIN CANS can now be deposited together for curbside pick-up or in the designated "mixed" recyclables bin.</b>		
<b>GLASS JARS &amp; BOTTLES</b> 	Food & beverage bottles & jars only!	Rinse, remove lids & lead bands-paper labels are fine. Place all "mixed"/commingled recyclables together in one container for curbside pick-up, or in the "mixed"/commingled recycling container at your dumpster location (keep separate from paper).	<b>NO</b> jar lids, drinking glasses, window glass, ceramics, plates, ovenware, crystal, mirrors, stained glass or green glass bottles. These & other types of glass contain contaminants & have different melting temperatures.
<b>PLASTIC BOTTLES</b> 	<b>#1-7 Plastics!</b> * Liter pop bottles; milk, water & orange juice jugs; laundry detergent bottles.  <b>*Plastics are subject to change. Please contact our offices at 923-5110 for more information.</b>	Check for recycling emblems on container bottoms labeled Type 1-7. Rinse, remove lids & flatten-labels are fine. Place all "mixed"/commingled recyclables together in one container for curbside pick-up, or in the "mixed"/commingled recycling container at your dumpster location (keep separate from paper).	<b>NO</b> plastic bags, plastic lids, plastic without numbers, motor oil containers, tub containers (butter tubs, yogurt tubs, etc.) toys, flower pots, fast food containers. These & other types of plastics have different chemical compositions & have different melting temperatures.
<b>ALUMINUM &amp; TIN CANS</b> 	Food & beverage cans only! Aluminum, steel & tin cans (lids are fine); no foil, pie tins.	Rinse containers & crimp open end of tin cans shut-labels are fine. Place all "mixed"/commingled recyclables together in one container for curbside pick-up, or in the "mixed"/commingled recycling container at your dumpster location (keep separate from paper).	<b>NO</b> cans full of paint, scrap metal, coat hangers (take these to your dry cleaner), aerosol cans (purchase non-aerosol products whenever possible).
<b>PAPER MATERIALS:</b>	<b>We cannot accept wax paper, milk cartons, blueprints, fax paper (flimsy kind), chipboard, telephone books, day glow/neon paper or plastic envelopes with any grade of recyclable paper. We can no longer accept mixed paper for recycling. All paper must be sorted into one of the following three grades:</b>		
<b>NEWSPAPER &amp; MAGAZINES</b> 	Newspapers and magazines together only! Glossy coupons, advertisements & Sunday comics OK.	Stack all newspaper in separate container for curbside pick-up, or place in the "newspaper" recycling container at your dumpster location.	<b>NO</b> other paper materials. No phone books
<b>OFFICE PACK</b> 	Only white typing/copy paper, computer paper and envelopes (no plastic windows).	Office pack can be dropped off at the large green container at the Operations Facility located at 3745 Owl Creek Road (past the Pines subdivision entrance on opposite side of Owl Creek Road).	<b>NO</b> wax paper (address label sheets), "dayglow/neon" paper (Astrobrights), Tyvek or plastic envelopes (overnight mailers), pads of sticky notes, telephone books, newspapers, magazines, brochures w/glue, chipboard, corrugated cardboard.
<b>CORRUGATED CARDBOARD</b> 	Only clean corrugated cardboard (look for the wavy corrugations between layers) <b>Chipboard is okay (Cereal boxes)!</b>	Empty & flatten. Remove staples & all packing materials. Stack and place corrugated cardboard beside dumpsters for pick-up	For more information about recycling please call 923-5110.
