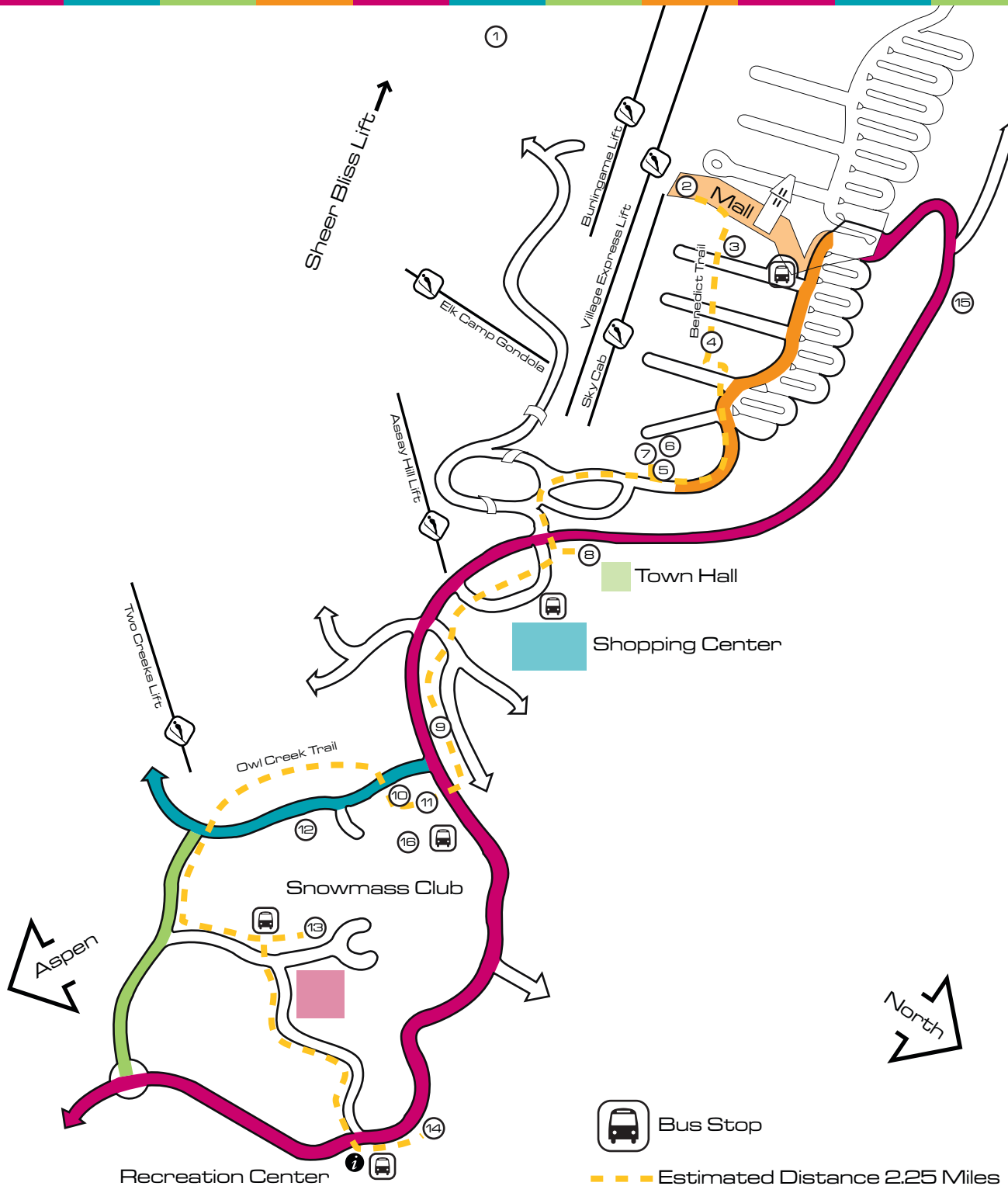

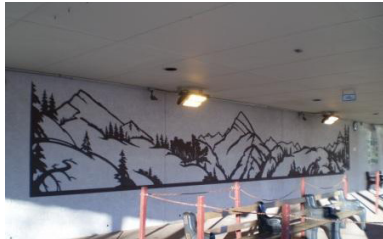

She has wings formed like diamonds, these are metaphors for the gift of intellect, which in turn gives her the ability to fly in mind and spirit. She sets regal atop a giant stone, surrounded by flowers in summer and blankets of white in winter. She is ready for the moment when she can take us with her on a journey through the minds eye.

He served on the Board of County Commissioners from 1980-1988 and on the Town of Snowmass Village Council from 1990-1994. His dedication to the community he loved will be remembered in this public art sculpture. Funding for the Blake Memorial came from donations in Tom's memory.  This installation was awarded to me after a statewide search for an artist to fulfill the jury's interest in uniting Snowmass Village's mining and resort history and a sense of community. My design reflects the feeling of the mountains, shapes of mining shafts and the inter connectedness of community members. The values of the community were discussed at a town meeting from which 11 words were gathered and sandblasted onto the sculpture. I intend these words to add a center point for these community aspirations "etched in stone" and renewed with each visit to the sculpture
