- We are keeping the boilers for Carriage Way (Snowmelt Road) up and operating until June 1. So, expect a blizzard on June 2 when the construction crews start the on-site work to replace those boilers.

- Construction of the new Hawk Ridge Trail is scheduled to begin on June 1.
