That said, we DO need to ensure we comply with food safety regulation so we may need to make some adjustments to what can be brought by the public for the potluck. In addition to the Viewline stepping up bigtime for this event, we will work with our other partners at the Rotary Club, Snowmass Chapel, East West Partners, and the Romero Group to get everything off the ground and paid for. - Vic Simon, our newest Police Officer is doing well at the Police Academy. We plan to have him on the streets of Snowmass Village before the busy holiday season arrives.
- Speaking of new folks, welcome to our new IT support specialist Chris Simmons
- And even though he is not new.....congrats to Felipe Moncada-Ortega on his promotion to lead driver in the Transportation Department.
- We are still about three transit drivers short of being fully staffed. If we are unable to fill these positions, we will likely need to make some adjustments to levels of service, similar to what we did last year, on some of the routes.
- The hot tub at the Recreation Center will be resurfaced starting November 14. This once every 16 year effort will take about 3 weeks to complete.
- The Brush Creek Culvert project design is underway. SGM has been hired to lead this effort on behalf of the Town. Engineers, surveyors and other professionals were out today on site "pot-holing" for utilities to help with the design work. We learned this week a that the Water and Sanitation has decided to participate in this project and upgrade their utilities while the road is underconstruction. We are still in the process of finding a contractor that can take on this project next year.
- The Base Village Developers (contractors and East West) had Wood Road paved last week. Unfortunately for them, the asphalt that went down did not meet the required specifications. We expect the asphalt to last through the winter, but next summer they will need to redo the paving project.
- The fiber optic cable project continues to inch forward.

- The Black Hills gas line extension up and over Owl Creek Road will continue into Town next year. We are working hard to coordinate this critical utility work, with the Highline Road widening.
- The new boilers for Base Village portion of Carriage Way are up and operating. Just in time!
- The scaffolding will start come down early next week for this phase of the Mountain View rehabilitation project. This first phase will finish around Thanksgiving..... And then next Spring we will start all over again with Phase 2.
- We continue to expect Viceroy phase 2 (13 B) to start in Novmeber.
