#### SMILE YOU'RE ON (NOT SO) CANDID CAMERA

Snowmass Village PD is in the process of implementing our new body worn camera program. State law requires that every police department in the state start using body cameras. In addition to cameras on each officer, our new police cars are also equipped with cameras. We have the required policies in place and will continue to work through the kinks of a new system over the coming weeks. In the meantime, smile!

#### TID BITS

- We continue to engineer and analyze potential designs to develop the best solution to the failing culvert under Brush Creek Road at Owl Creek Road. Last week we discovered that there is an additional unexpected layer of asphalt about 4 feet below the existing roadway. The guesstimate is that back in the 70's or 80's the road elevation was raised and the old asphalt was just left in place. We are continuing to work to locate existing utilities so the eventual design is accurate. We plan to interview contractors in the next couple of weeks and receive their input as to the best design and construction options we have going forward.
- Due in part to the active bear season we just endured, we are exploring ideas to prevent fruit trees from being planted in the future and ideas to replace existing fruit trees in Town; hopefully eliminating more reasons for bears to come to Town to dine.
- The Planning Commission continues to explore opportunities to change and improve our parking standards for new developments.
- Speaking of development, neither Deerbrook nor Enclave may be far enough along in their respective remodels to be eligible to receive Temporary Certificates of Occupancy (TCO) this winter. A TCO cannot be issued if the required safety requirements (fire suppression, etc) are not in place.
- Party on Waye! Be sure to RSVP for this year's holiday party on December 2.
- The Community Survey results are in. We hope to give them to the Council at the November 21 Council meeting.
- Due to staff shortages, the Route #3 Shuttle services will have 20 minute headways this season, rather than the traditional 15 minute services. In addition, like last year, we will also need to reduce some service on the Route #2 through the winter.

- The scaffolding continues to come down on Mountain View rehabilitation project.
- The Mall Transit Center is slated to start review in front of the Planning Commission on November 30. We expect the project to be in front of the Council in January.
- The Thanksgiving Community Potluck is set for Sunday November 20.
- The Town is working with our partners at Pitkin County, Aspen, Basalt and AVH to change the way we provide detox and homeless shelter services. Details are being finalized, but we think we will be better able to more effectively and efficiently utilize existing funding to operate both a 4 bed detox facility and a temporary homeless shelter in the Health and Human Services Building. We are supporting this innovative idea to deliver these critical services.
- We started soil testing at the Draw Site this week to help with the analysis of potential development.
